Idiomatic expressions are a type of informal language that have a different meaning.

Here are some idiomatic expressions:

- They were **tickled pink** because of the boys' recuperation. (**Very happy**)
- People have been **down in the dumps** because of this new disease. (**Sad or depressed**)
- Mike feels **sick as a dog**. (**Very sick**)
- Bring your boots and umbrella. It's **raining cats and dogs** now. (**Hard rain**)
- This competition was **a piece of cake**. (**Very easy**)



- This cell phone costs **an arm and a leg**. (It's extremely expensive)
- I was just **pulling your leg**. (Just joking)
- **It's Greek to me**. (I don't understand)
- **Hold your horses**. (Be patient)
- I will wake up at 5 a.m. **when pigs fly**. (Never)
- We are all in **the same boat**. (In the same position)
- **Keep your chin up**. (Be happy)


